From the Kiln Committee

Pouring the foundation for the new kiln. September 2022

In January, the kiln committee met before the general meeting at League headquarters in Concord. After the reports of several subcommittees and some discussion, the decision was made to build the kiln shed addition and woodshed in 2023 and the new kiln in 2024. Fundraising will continue in 2023 to raise the full amount needed.

Kiln shed extension and wood sheds.

We plan to start this project in April of 2023 weather permitting. The groundwork, sono-tubes and cement pads are in place. Some site work remains for the positioning of the woodshed or sheds. We also have the hemlock poles ready to go.

We are looking for a leader, or leaders for this project. We have the plans and measurements for the new trusses based on the existing kiln shed built in 2008. The leader should have building and construction experience and will work with someone to purchase the materials. Please contact Barbara Sorce @ 603-568-4731 with any questions or ideas.

Retaining wall and stairs

An additional project has been created to finish the work and kiln loading area around the kiln, including a retaining wall and stairs for safe entry on the North side of the kiln building. This is envisioned as bricked or stone flooring. If anyone is interested in helping with this project or has access to products please let us know.

Anagama kiln construction will begin in the summer of 2024 and will be lead by Eric Maglio and Belinda Bodnar. We are in the preliminary phase for this project with drawings of the new kiln and a materials list. We also have many donated used bricks on site, collected for the project. The cost for this project will be in excess of \$20,000.

We are also looking for a volunteer to manage a photo library to record NHPG activities and use for social media and fundraising.
